Workshop location

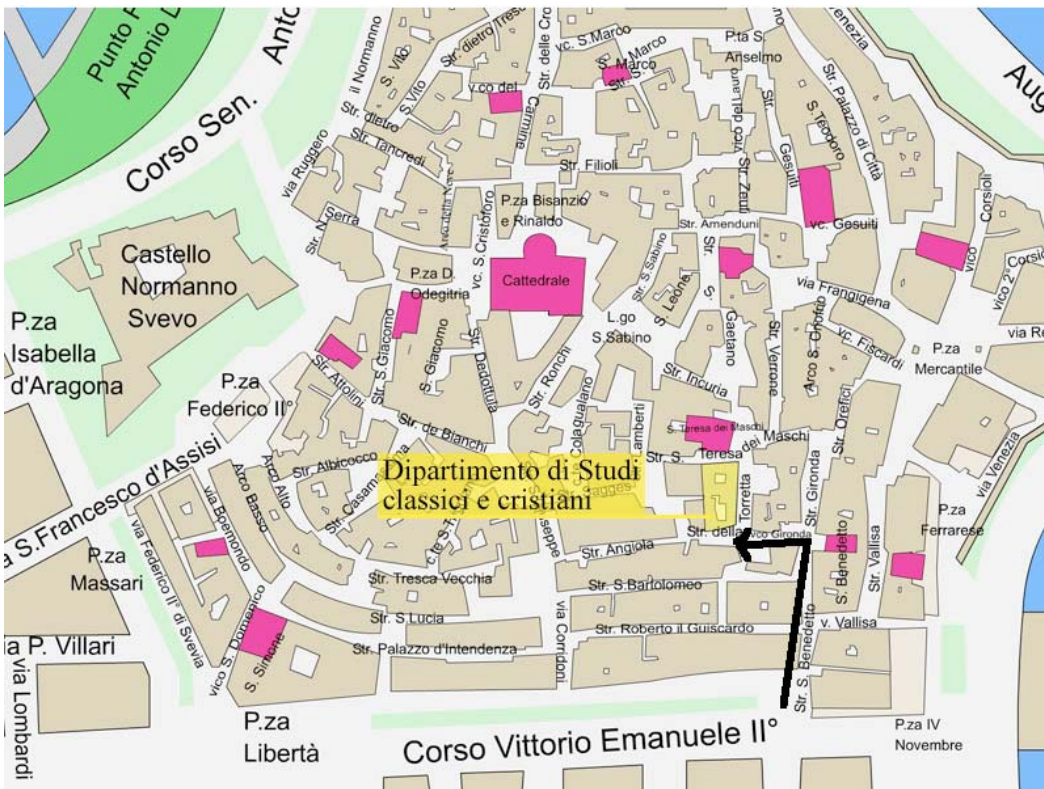
