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Title of the Research Project	The Legal Discipline of Protected Natural Areas, between Environmental Protection and Territory Government.
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Summary of the Research Project

The research work will be aimed at identifying the legal instruments for the protection of nature and biodiversity referred to in the framework law n. 394 of 1991 and the regional laws in force in order to integrate the various technical assessments relating to autonomous investigation procedures and define a General Implementing Regulation for the "management" of Protected Areas that takes into account the community matrix deriving from the belonging of the prestigious sites in question to Natura 2000 network, as well as the authorization activities interfering with the Park's protection regulations such as the EIA (Environmental Impact Assessment), the PAUR (Single Regional Authorization Measure), the VINCA (Incidence Assessment) and the AU (Single Authorization), SEA (Strategic Environmental Assessment).

Specific guidelines for environmental sustainability and Guidelines for the Development of the Territory in Protected Natural Areas and the legal regime for the use and enhancement of the Landscape will also be defined, including the analysis of the sanctioning aspects.
