Learning Objectives	Acquisition of in-depth skills in reading, interpreting and contextualising Greek sites, monuments and materials. Improving the critical ability to knowledge and understand themes, events and expressions of the artistic and material culture of proper Greece from the Protogeometric period to the Hellenistic age.
Course prerequisites	Knowledge of general and historical geographic elements of the Mediterranean and European area, Greek and Roman history and history of classical art. It is also required skill in understand and re-elaborating specific content in the Italian language and in (at least one) foreign language.

Teaching strategy	The lectures will come with multimedia presentations of specific contents of the discipline and with shared exercises on research, use and critical evaluation of the tools for further study. Visits to some sites and museums in South Italy will provide if possible.
