<b>Study Program</b>	
Content	The course is divided into two parts: a first theoretical part, focused on the contrastive analysis of the English language and the Italian language from a phonetic-phonological, morpho-syntactic and lexical point of view; a second practice, in which the theoretical framework will be applied for the analysis, translation and understanding of newspaper articles or extracts from texts from English to Italian and vice versa focused on scientific disciplines.
