Syllabus	
Learning Objectives	<p>The objective of the course is to enable the acquisition of knowledge about the basics, general principles of criminal law and the penalty system. This knowledge base facilitates the understanding of the logical-functional links between the fundamental institutes of the general part of criminal law, the ratio of protection of the criminal legal system also in the constitutional framework and with regard to the increasing interaction with European law.</p> <p>Through a critical approach to the problematic issues pointed out by doctrine and jurisprudence and to a logical-functional analysis of the institutes and principles, the student will be able to independently carry out a correct exegesis of the provisions of the general part covered by the course.</p> <p>It is intended to achieve these objectives through: interactive lectures, periodic verifications, and group research for in-depth study. The lecturer, in fact, in carrying out these activities, will invite students to use exercises to verify the quantitative and qualitative degree of knowledge learned, in order to acquire knowledge of the criminal law institutions covered. In particular, interactive discussion among students will stimulate and foster the ability to make logical connections between prior information and new content.</p>

Contents	Function and role of criminal law. The legal assets and the Constitution Principles of criminal law: legality/rule of law, guilt, materiality, offensiveness. Immunity. Administrative liability of entities. Prison sentences and fines. Extinction of the offence. Alternative measures to detention. Security measures. Prevention measures.

Methods of assessment	<i>Through the presentation of group research and an individual oral examination</i>
Evaluation criteria	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Knowledge and understanding</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Students will acquire through lectures, exercises and seminars their ability to understand the criminal law legislation. On the basis of the acquired expertise, they will be able to comprehend technical texts and research articles on the relevant topics and themes. • <i>Applying knowledge and understanding</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Through the notions acquired during the lecture and exercise hours, students will be able to apply the contents acquired with their out-of-class study of knowing and understanding through the discussion of case studies that are inspired by the news section or events of legal processes (sentences/judgements). The analysis and the discussion of real problematic situations will allow the student to identify the juridically relevant profiles in addition to the functionality of procedural and substantive institutions. • <i>Autonomy of judgment</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ This aim will be achieved through practical exercises. For example, students will have to reconstruct an unknown case study, starting from the teaching material (facsimiles of documents and legal provisions) which the teacher will make available for them. Such an activity aims at developing, on the basis of the information analysis, the personal judgement as well as the ability of analysing and objectively observing the relevant elements of the concrete situation. • <i>Communicating knowledge and understanding</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ On the basis of the acquired notions, students will be able to communicate with specialists and non-specialists, in writing and speaking. Ability to expose the criminal law concepts in an orderly manner and to correctly use the related terminology. The aim of developing a clear and efficient communicative ability will be achieved through some linked and coordinated activities: text comprehension, selection of the essential information in the definition of a problem, identification of the reference criminal law rules. After an in-depth reading, students will be asked to identify
