| Evaluation criteria                                       | <p>- Knowledge and Ability to Understand:<br/>The student shall demonstrate that he/she has acquired the basic notions relating to the European Union and the main EU institutions, its functioning and its system of judicial protection as well as the relations between the legal systems with particular regard to the Italian legal system and the faculties of EU citizens.</p> <p>- Applied knowledge and understanding:<br/>The student shall display knowledge of the European Union and its nature as an international organisation, the European institutional, regulatory and jurisdictional system. The student contextualises and correctly applies European Union law.</p> <p>- Autonomy of judgement:<br/>The student shall interpret norms of European derivation, ranging from institutional and regulatory to jurisdictional and European citizenship issues.</p> <p>- Communication skills:<br/>The student shall report on the European Union and EU rules on the functioning of the institutional and jurisdictional apparatus, on the States' membership of the Union, on the Union's competences and division with the Member States, on the citizenship of the Union, on the relationship between European Union law and domestic law with particular regard to Italian law. | Criteria for assessment and attribution of the final mark | <p>The oral exam, through the articulation of questions relating to the syllabus and interaction with the student, will allow to ascertain that the latter has effectively acquired the knowledge and skills required.</p> <p>The assessment is expressed by a grade in 30ths, with honours if applicable. For students who take the mid-term examination, the grade obtained will be averaged with the oral examination, which will cover the remainder of the syllabus. For students who do not pass the intermediate test or refuse the grade, the oral test will cover the whole syllabus.</p> <p>For the attribution of the final grade, the level of preparation achieved in accordance with the aforementioned criteria will be taken into account and, in line with the expected learning outcomes, the different levels of preparation will lead to different judgments: excellent (30/30 with honours), very good (28/29), good (25/27), satisfactory (21/24), sufficient (18/20). The honours are awarded on the basis of the previous unanimous consent of the examination committee in case of high-quality performance.</p>   |
