Syllabus	
Learning Objectives	The aim is to provide a basic knowledge of the institutional European Union law, its impact on national law and the dynamics of the internal market with particular reference to the free movement of persons (also in the perspective of the right to family reunification), the protection of migrant minors and social policy.
Course prerequisites	The EU law exam must be preceded by passing the public law exam, pursuant to the didactic regulations of the degree course.
Contents	The course program is divided into two parts, conceptually autonomous but integrated from the point of view of contents:  1) Institutional Law:  - The origins and evolution of European integration. The structure and fundamental principles of the European Union.  The division of EU / State competences.  - The institutional framework of the European Union: The European Council. Advice. The European Parliament. The European Commission.  - The Court of Justice and the Court and judicial protection, in particular the appeal for non-compliance, for annulment, the action in default and the reference for a preliminary ruling.  - The sources of EU law: the rules of the Treaties and the Charter of Fundamental Rights. Regulations, Directives,

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Assessment and feedback	
Methods of assessment	Oral interview. HOWEVER, if deemed appropriate by the teacher, in consideration of the number of students enrolled in the exam, the knowledge check will be based on a written and oral evaluation. The written test is made up of multiple choice questions or a short essay and aims to ascertain the knowledge of the basic institutes European Union law. Students who pass the mid-term test (the mark for which will be taken into account in the final assessment), will complete the examination by taking the oral examination on the section of European Union law not covered by the "exemption". (**For the purposes of the examination, students attending no less than 80% of the total number of hours of lessons will be regarded as attending). For those who do not pass the mid-term test, refuse the mark or do not take it, the oral examination will cover the whole programme.
Evaluation criteria	The final grade is determined by the set of assessments that the examining commission expresses in reference to the clarity of the





	exposition, the completeness of the acquired knowledge, the property of the specific vocabulary of the subject, the depth of knowledge, the ability to analyze the questions and provide suitable answers.
