The vote is expressed in thirtieths. Grade is based on: knowledge of the programme; accuracy in exposure; ability to critically process the acquired knowledge.</p> <p>The criteria followed for the evaluation of the learning outcomes expressed out of thirty are:</p> <p>Insufficient: 0-17</p>
