Expected learning outcomes	<p>Knowledge and understanding on: The student will have to know the main notions on international trade and subjects operating in this context, as well as on the discipline of international contracts.</p> <p>It will be initiated to the acquisition of reading and understanding skills of technical documents in the disciplinary field (general conditions of contract, transport documents, credit agreements).</p> <p>It will be initiated to the acquisition of critical assessment skills of the negotiating tools ordinarily used in the disciplinary field, as well as to the (embryonic) production of technical documents in the same area.</p>

	He will be placed in a position to deepen his knowledge of international contracts through the preparation and participation of seminars on specific issues with the help of industry experts.
Contents	<p>Sources: internal sources, sources of community origin, sources of interstate origin, sources of astatual origin.
