Expected learning outcomes	<p><i>Knowledge and understanding on:</i></p> <p>The aim of teaching labour law is to provide students with knowledge of the EU, national and regional regulatory framework for active labour and employment policy, as well as the individual and collective discipline of the employment relationship, with particular attention to the types of contracts also in the public sector. Particular attention will be paid to the instruments governing the labour market, with reference both to finding employment (active labour policy) and to the safeguards provided in the event of loss of employment (social shock absorbers). Further consideration will also be given to employment policy instruments.</p> <p><i>Applying knowledge and understanding on:</i></p> <p>The student, on the basis of the knowledge acquired, will have to be able to handle disputes regarding employment relationships and all the problems connected to them</p> <p><i>Making informed judgements and choices</i></p>

	<p>The student is provided with methods of approach to the normative data that allow him/her to independently resolve any problem he/she may have in the field of labour disputes.</p> <p><i>Communicating knowledge and understanding</i> In addition, the student must acquire, at the end of the course, the legal vocabulary necessary to govern the regulatory material</p> <p><i>Capacities to continue learning</i> Infine, lo studente attraverso l'approfondimento della materia dovrà acquisire una buona capacità di analisi del materiale normativo.</p>
