Syllabus	
Learning Objectives	The first module intends to study the organization and functioning of the Italian legal system, deepening the principles dictated by the Constitutional Charter, in order to acquire the basic preparation in administrative law.  The second module is aimed at training the student on the fundamental topics of the subject, as well as transmitting a correct study method and the indispensable tools to successfully face any selection banned by public administrations located throughout the country. In particular, the course aims to prepare students to work in the public administration, as well as to fill managerial or administrative positions in public companies and in private companies that carry out activities of public interest.  Finally, the third module provides; basic notions regarding the development of the territory, as well as fundamental notions for launching innovative start-ups, focusing, in particular, on the role of local and regional administrations in the promotion and financing of start-ups.

	evaluated by the examination commission, verifying, through an oral interview that the student has acquired the legal vocabulary necessary to face and cover managerial positions, as well as to provide advice on concrete issues, through analysis of the regulatory framework.
