Texts from the 1st to the 5th century will be read and commented on, in relation to the main themes of the history of Christianity and their peculiar contextual and formal elements. Teaching Methods	The course is based on an interdisciplinary didactic method, through face to face lectures that are integrated with slides and deepened by workshops. The course also offers some lectures given by experts from different Italian and foreign Universities.
