Syllabus		
Learning Objectives	The primary objective of the course is to provide highly specialized analysis tools, suitable for understanding in depth the structure of a literary text in its specificities and in its compositional elements.	
	Attention to the formal components of the text, the analysis of the rhetorical figures present and the author variants, guarantee an understanding of the dialectical relationship between form / content, and the semanticity of the formal elements of the text.	
	The exam program is based on the direct reading of the texts and on a critical use that allows to highlight, with adequate methodological tools, the content, the style, the figurality, the relationship with tradition.	
Course prerequisites	Knowledge, at a basic level, of the main elements of the poetic and narrative style and of the essential characters of versification is desirable.	
Contents	The tradition of modernity: forms of Leopardi's lyric: Exegesis of the <i>Canti</i> di Leopardi, to focus on the metric, stylistic and expressive novelty brought by Leopardi's lyric in the poetic tradition. There will be multiple insights and articulations on the basis of specific studies, of a critical and theoretical type, and of adequate methodological knowledge of the stylistic and rhetorical field. Particular attention will be paid to the	

	twentieth-century outcomes of Leopardi's poetic forms.

Assessment and feedback	
Methods of assessment	The final exam will consist in an oral interview in order to verify the critical acquisition of the topics covered during the lessons. The examination timetable is published on the site of the Degree Course and on Esse3. To register for the examination, usage of the Esse3 system is mandatory
Evaluation criteria	Knowledge and understanding
	 The student's ability to appropriate the analysis tools of literary texts, and the awareness of the methodologies acquired and knowledge of bibliographic paths will be examined.
	Applying knowledge and understanding
	The student must be able to perform exegesis applied to literary texts
	other than those considered by the teacher, and must contextualize them in the historical and cultural areas of reference.
	Autonomy of judgment
	 The critical ability reached by the student will be evaluated through the comparison with the texts and with the specialist bibliography, and the interpretative attitude.
	Communicating knowledge and understanding
	 The ability to argue in an articulated way and with a precise lexicon on the issues raised by the critical investigations carried out and the methodological-hermeneutical perspectives adopted will be evaluated.
	Communication skills
	The student will be expected to have good skills in communicating the acquired notions by using – where necessary – an appropriate specialist terminology
	Capacities to continue learning
	 The student's ability to make good use of the methodological tools acquired and to show an aptitude for critical study of new cultural paths will be assessed.
Criteria for assessment and attribution of the final mark	The final exam will consist of an oral interview aimed at verifying the intelligent, operational and critical assimilation of cultural contents, the ability to establish links and comparisons between the topics covered by the lessons, the organicity and fluidity of the presentation. An element of evaluation will be active participation in the course and in seminars and conferences.
