Assessment methods	Written exam is formed by open-ended answers with score; it involves a practical exercise focused on pragmatic-textual analysis of a short extract. Students will have to demonstrate they have acquired minimum contents of the discipline and be able to carry out a pragmatic analysis of different texts. Intermediate tests re not foreseen .
