Syllabus	
Prerequisites/requirements	Advanced knowledge of the history and characters of Italian literature and of the essential characters of at least one European literature. Methodological knowledge of literary analysis, metrical and rhetorical skills. Knowledge of Spanish is not required, but attendance of the Spanish language workshop is strongly recommended.
Expected learning outcomes (according to Dublin Descriptors) (it is recommended that they are congruent with the learning outcomes contained in A4a, A4b, A4c tables of the SUA-CdS)	 On completion of this module the successful student will have reached the following: a solid competence in Spanish literary culture and history, related to the specific time span under examination; ability to locate literary texts and related contexts within their appropriate literary background and time; ability to read and contextualise a literary text, in its more complex facets and to identify and analyse different text types and literary genres; enhanced ability to communicate in Spanish in a range of specific topics and issues in Spanish literature and culture, using both the primary and secondary sources correctly; enhanced ability to recognise and critically reflect on the constant historical evolution of text and forms.

Course program	Critical investigation of a specific topic in Spanish literature. On the basis of the acquisitions of the three-year course, in the Master's degree courses the aim is to lead students along a research path, making them confront on the one hand with the texts and on the other hand with the specific critical bibliography. Don Quijote de la Mancha: from book to myth. The course explores the genesis of Cervantes' novel, the links with literary genres and the previous Spanish and Italian literary tradition, the innovative and peculiar elements of Cervantes' narrative formula, including the elements of theatricality contained in the novel. The novel will also be analysed in relation to contemporary literature and baroque artistic manifestations that help to understand its structure and meaning. The influence of Cervantes' famous novel on the literature of the following centuries will also be explored.
