Students will be able to discuss it using the specific terminology of the discipline, and through autonomous analysis of documents and passages of historical authors. Students will demonstrate the ability to approach texts and data critically.	

Evaluation criteria	 The student must demonstrate: knowledge of the learning contents in a critical and analytical way; that he is able to elaborate personal judgments on his torical phenomena, starting from the critical reading of the sources; his ability to use the technical language of the discipline In particular, students' awareness will be assessed: how little historical reconstructions are objective; that narrative sources are never one mere reflection of reality.
