Assessment methods	The final exam will take place mainly in oral form.
	During the course, written tests (October and November) on specific sections
	of the syllabus are scheduled.



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	The results of these tests will constitute credits for the final overall assessment. The laboratory activities will be verified through a project work developed in groups to be presented during the final exam. The results of the written tests will be communicated in the course Teams channel. The partial tests are also open to students who cannot attend the course.
