Evaluation criteria	<p>The student have to show:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) a basic understanding of principal authors of modern thought; 2) the ability to know and understand philosophical texts studied during the course, in their specific lexicon, in their historical roots and in their respective contexts; 3) the ability to elaborate an evaluate in a critical way the problems of the modern philosophical tradition with specific reference to their posterity; 4) the ability to identify and clearly communicate the conceptual

	frameworks of texts and doctrines of modern Philosophy, with specific reference to their argumentative lines; 5) a verified ability to keep learning of philosophical problems, with particular respect to the link between questions and answers.
