Contents of teaching	religious phenomena through precise historical contexts The course purpose is to investigate the modalities and the forms of the spreading and the development of Christendom, from the beginning to the Late-Antique, relating to the birth of the Church as an Institution, and with particular attention to the transition from heresy to orthodoxy, from the churches to the Church,. Issues related to the impact of Christianism with paganism will be object of this study, with particular reference to the pesecutions; the organisation of the first communities; to the role that women played; to the creation of the ecclesiastical hierarchy; to how the concept of 'primacy of the Church' was created, to the birth of martyr and saint worship, to the related development of pilgrimage and the sanctuarial phenomenon.

Didactic methods	An important part of the course is the active and critical participation of the students (comment to the source dossier, oral presentation of matters that are interesting for the students), as well as the front lessons. Lessons are supported by projections of powerpoint presentations to stimulate the involvement of the students.

The student must also prove the acquirement of the terminology and the research methodology which are specific to the subject matter.
