Expected learning outcomes	<p><i>Knowledge and understanding</i> The student will have to know, at least in the essential lines, political-institutional, socio-economic and cultural events and processes of the modern age, understanding and recognizing the essential turning points of the period.</p> <p><i>Applying knowledge and understanding</i> Through a critical acquisition of the proposed content, the student will have to acquire the ability to contextualize and utilize some direct or indirect sources.</p> <p><i>Making informed judgements and choices</i> From the elaboration of information acquired from sources and from historiography, the student will develop personal critical judgment skills in relation to the specific discipline, extensible to even greater problems and issues.</p> <p><i>Communicating knowledge and understanding</i> The student will have to acquire the specificities of the historical language and learn how to use it in an appropriate manner.</p>

	<p><i>Capacities to continue learning</i> Acquired disciplinary skills and critical judgment self-assessment capabilities will enable the student to address the complexity of the next level of study.</p>
Contents	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The course will provide the student with an adequate basic background about general history from the end of the fifteenth and early nineteenth centuries. Particular attention will be given to political history, without neglecting themes of demographic, economic, social, cultural, religious history.
