Prerequisites/requirements	Knowledge of the main events of the western History and basic features of the global History.
Expected learning outcomes	<p><i>Knowledge and understanding</i> The student will know the development of the events of the Roman History; the students will develop an understanding on one hand of the multiple factors which lead to a given historical event, on the other hand all of its social, economic, political consequences.</p> <p><i>Applying knowledge and understanding</i> The student will be able to distinguish the nature of the sources necessary for historical reconstruction and, on this basis, the student will acquire the ability to reconstruct the historical "fact".</p> <p><i>Critical Thinking</i> The student will be able to formulate simple personal judgements, based on historical sources and modern bibliography.</p>

	<p><i>Communication Skills</i> The student will acquire specific historical vocabulary to be able to correctly describe historical actors, phenomena and processes.</p> <p><i>Independent Learning Skills</i> The student will be able to perform a basic bibliographic and documentary research on specific topics.</p>
