	Knowledge and applied capability of understanding  The course aims to educate to the aesthetic phenomena in a critical and historical perspective — in general and with a special focus on art — considering a possible applied impact in any professional context related to the artistic field, or to the aestheticization process of the

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	social life and the environment.
	Autonomy of judgment
	The course aims to develop, through a closed comparison with the texts of philosophy and history of thought, a critical and autonomous judgment of the student into a broad discipline related — for various reason — to cognitive, critical and stylistic problems.
	Communication skills
	The analysis of the problems concerning philosophy and its application to the theories of sensitivity and art is aimed, in particular, to the development of the communication skills of the student – on the double front of thought processing and critical reflection on styles and figurations.
	Capability of learning
	The students will acquire, in particular, a good capability of reading and comparing the philosophical texts: this is the essential aim for any scholar of philosophy or criticism, in the literary or artistic sphere.
