Expected learning outcomes	<p>The aim of this course is to analytically examine principles of TORT LIABILITY to students with a view to enabling them to master the main categories of the subject and the fundamentals of the legal interpretation methodology, as well as develop their command of the legal language about tort law and capacity for systematic understanding of the institutions. Dogmatic analysis of the categories is combined with attention to case law, in order to verify recent developments of the law</p>

At the same time lecturer will raise questions and issues, encouraging students’ participation, reasoning, critical analysis and the developing of possible solutions to specific legal profiles

Evaluation criteria	Students must reproduce the descriptive and argumentative lines learnt in the lectures and from the textbook. The interview is aimed at testing the students’ knowledge of the subjects studied and their understanding.
