The teaching aims to provide fundamental knowledge and study methods to understand the evolution of European law and legal culture.

Contents	The Early Middle Ages: causes and effects of the fall of the Western Roman Empire. <i>Corpus Iuris Civilis</i> , Lombard domination in Italy, the Church, the Holy Roman Empire. The age of common law: the birth of universities, the rebirth of cities, the Bolognese school, the Glossators, the Commentators, the treatises, the <i>Utrumque ius</i> , birth and development of canon law, the <i>Communis opinio</i> . Legal humanism. Natural law and lighting.
