Learning Objectives	<p>The Agri-Food Law Course aims to provide the main knowledge related to the European and national regulatory framework of agricultural and food law, with particular reference to food safety, information rules, the enhancement of the quality of agri-food products, the rules of the supply chain and the discipline of agricultural enterprises.</p> <p>Students will analyze the main regulatory reference sources of agri-food legislation, gaining understanding of a multi-level regulatory framework. The normative data will be placed side by side to the analysis of the jurisprudence of the Court of Justice of the EU and of the National Courts of various Countries, also in language, in order to allow the deepening of the dealt legal problems.</p>
