The evaluation will take place in thirty from 18 to 30.  An exam is deemed to be passed successfully if the final grade is equal to or higher than 18/30.	
Criteria for assessment and attribution of the final mark	Students must show the knowledge of the descriptive and argumentative lines learnt in the lectures and from the textbook.  The interview is aimed at testing: -the students' knowledge of the subjects studied and their understanding; -to verify the students' degree of knowledge of the rules and of the institutions; -to verify their mastery of the categories of tort law and their ability to exemplify and re-elaborate the contents acquired.
