Learning Objectives	<i>The student should acquire the knowledge necessary to understand the relationship between law and religion in multicultural society, with a view to a methodology of law analysis from a cross-cultural perspective</i>
Course prerequisites	<i>Constitutional law and private law</i>
And private law Contents	The course in church law is aimed at learning about the relationship between law and religion, particularly the understanding of the influence of religion on legal systems, both as a fideistic and anthropological phenomenon. In particular, the course will focus on cross-cultural methodology for studying the problems posed by multireligiousness and multiculturalism. The themes of the course will focus on the analysis of the principles of religious freedom, religious equality and secularism in its first part. The second part will be devoted to the study of some classic institutions of ecclesiastical law: marriage and ecclesiastical bodies and in general the patrimonial aspects related to the religious phenomenon
