## **Expected learning outcomes**

The course of Agri-Food Law aims to provide the main knowledge relating to the European and national regulatory framework of agricultural and food law, with particular reference to food safety, labelling, quality of agri-food products, supply chain and national regulation of agricultural enterprises.
