Learning Objectives	The course aims to provide the contents of merit and method useful for the preliminary planning activities and development of specific paths of teaching Italian in the contexts of a foreign language (Italian abroad) and a second language (Italian taught in Italy as a non-maternal), with reference also to the bases of institutional planning offered by Community policy documents.
Course prerequisites	The course takes place in the first year of the course; therefore, no specific pre- requisites are required, neither for regularly enrolled students nor for students of other interested degree courses. It could be useful, but absolutely not essential, to add the attendance of the language teaching course (Glottodidattica).
