	literary text also in a multicultural and comparative dimension; consolidation of the student's expressive skills in oral and written Italian, also with a view to a more conscious learning of foreign languages.
<b>Course prerequisites</b>	A good knowledge, at school level, of the Italian and European historical-literary coordinates is desirable. It is also advisable to have an adequate knowledge of the logical-syntactic structures of the Italian language.
<b>Teaching strategie</b>	The Course includes lectures and seminars. In addition, written exercises of an individual and collective nature will be carried out in the hours of Analysis, interpretation and writing of texts.
<b>Expected learning outcomes in terms of</b>	
<b>Knowledge and understanding on:</b>	<p>The Course aims to offer:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• a broad and comprehensive knowledge of the historical and cultural dynamics in the history of Italian literature, from the origins to the twentieth century;</li> <li>• a good ability to analyze and interpret the works and authors examined in their multiple aspects (content, style, continuity with the tradition, innovative);</li> <li>• a more mature approach to Italian literary texts from a European perspective, useful for the purposes of international and intercultural mediation;</li> <li>• necessary skills in the elaboration of a text: adequate linguistic properties, correct use of logical-syntactic structures, skills argumentative and expository clarity.</li> </ul>
<b>Applying knowledge and understanding on:</b>	<p>The Course aims to consolidate:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• critical skills, aimed at reflecting on the historical-cultural present;</li> <li>• interdisciplinary and intercultural skills;</li> <li>• ability to apply the knowledge acquired in view of a future career in the field of teaching, tourism or intercultural mediation.</li> </ul>
<b>Soft skills</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>Making informed judgments and choices</i></li> </ul> <p>The Course intends to refine the interpretative dispositions of the student with a literary text, on the basis of a well-founded critical bibliography and at the same time of an autonomous spirit of reflection.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>Communicating knowledge and understanding</i></li> </ul> <p>The Course aims to consolidate the expressive and argumentative skills of the student, also in terms of communication in the tourism and intercultural fields.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>Capacities to continue learning</i></li> </ul> <p>The attendance of the Course, the dialogue with the teacher and the comparison with the other students will allow to enhance the skills of connection and at the same time of discernment of the literary texts and of the concepts imparted: autonomously applicable skills both in subsequent degrees of training and in future experience working.</p>

<b>Assessment</b>	
Assessment methods	After passing a written test of suitability in Analysis, Interpretation and Writing of Texts (6 CFU), an oral test of Italian Literature (6 CFU) is foreseen. For the written test, consultation of the dictionary of the Italian language and the dictionary of synonyms and antonyms is permitted.
Assessment criteria	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>Knowledge and understanding</i></li> </ul> <p>The student will have to show knowledge and understanding, also in relation to the European historical-cultural dynamics, the works and thought of the Italian authors examined, from the origins to the twentieth century.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>Applying knowledge and understanding</i></li> </ul> <p>The student's ability to analyze, on the basis of the methodological approaches provided, the literary texts examined will be verified, placing them in an intercultural and interdisciplinary perspective, also aimed at the present.</p>

	<p>case well-founded, spirit of reflection.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>Communicating knowledge and understanding</i></li> </ul> <p>The student will have to be able to argue well the fundamental concepts and questions of Italian literary history.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>Communication skills</i></li> </ul> <p>Both in the written and oral tests, the student will have to demonstrate to be able to argue the concepts studied in a fluid and correct language.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>Capacities to continue learning</i></li> </ul> <p>The student's ability to appropriately connect the analyzed literary texts to each other will be assessed, clearly distinguishing the peculiarities of thought of each author and of the historical-literary movements of reference.</p>
Final exam and grading criteria	Eligibility (without attribution of marks) for the written test is foreseen. The measurement criteria of the oral interview will be expressed through a final grade out of thirty. The exam is considered passed when the vote is greater than or equal to 18. Honors can be awarded to the student who demonstrates having acquired high transversal skills (autonomy of judgment, communication skills, ability to learn independently).
