Learning Objectives	The fundamental objective of the Course is to provide useful tools for a more conscious critical approach in understanding the literary text and for a more mature writing practice.
Course prerequisites	A good knowledge, at school level, of the Italian and European historical-literary coordinates is desirable. It is also advisable to have an adequate knowledge of the logical-syntactic structures of the Italian language.
Contents	Italian Literature (6 CFU): General Topics: Literary history from origins to contemporaneity. Specific Topics: Galileo Galilei and the «new science»: rhetorical art and styles of thought. Analysis, interpretation and writing of texts (6 CFU): Passages chosen by the professor of Galileo's <i>Il Saggiatore</i> .

Knowledge and understanding on:		<p>The Course aims to offer:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. a broad and comprehensive knowledge of the historical and cultural dynamics in the history of Italian literature, from the origins to the twentieth century; 2. a good ability to analyze and interpret the works and authors examined in their multiple aspects (content, style, continuity with the tradition, innovative); 3. a more mature approach to Italian literary texts from a European perspective, useful for the purposes of international and intercultural mediation; 4. necessary skills in the elaboration of a text: adequate linguistic properties, correct use of logical-syntactic structures, skills argumentative and expository clarity.

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Assessment and feedback	
Methods of assessment	After passing a written test of suitability in Analysis, Interpretation and Writing of Texts (6 CFU), an oral test of Italian Literature (6 CFU) is foreseen.
Evaluation criteria	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Knowledge and understanding</i> <p>The student will have to show knowledge and understanding, also in relation to the European historical-cultural dynamics, the works and thought of the Italian authors examined, from the origins to the twentieth century.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Applying knowledge and understanding</i> <p>The student's ability to analyze, on the basis of the methodological approaches provided, the literary texts examined will be verified, placing them in an intercultural and interdisciplinary perspective, also aimed at the present.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Autonomy of judgment</i> <p>The student must show that he has developed an autonomous, and in any case well-founded, spirit of reflection.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Communicating knowledge and understanding</i> <p>The student will have to be able to argue well the fundamental concepts and questions of Italian literary history.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Communication skills</i> <p>Both in the written and oral tests, the student will have to demonstrate to be able to argue the concepts studied in a fluid and correct language.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Capacities to continue learning</i> <p>The student's ability to appropriately connect the analyzed literary texts to each other will be assessed, clearly distinguishing the peculiarities of thought of each author and of the historical-literary movements of reference.</p>
Criteria for assessment and attribution of the final mark	Eligibility for the written test is expected. The criteria for assessment the oral interview will be expressed by means of a final mark out of thirty.
