| | texts", in view of the oral test preselection written in advance. |
| Applying knowledge and understanding on: | The course aims at enhancing the interpretative skills of the student; the course also aims to enhance the taste of reading and historical sensibility, and to make clear to the student the formative value of literature in a strong interculturality dimension, to achieve an active citizenship and live a different quality of work. |
