Prerequisites/ Requirements	It is desirable that the student has knowledge of the historical development about <b>Italian Literature</b> , from the origins to the first years of the 20th century, in the awareness of the dynamic character of literary language; it is also desirable that the student has knowledge of varieties of literary genres and of ways of writing in the Italian language.

Teaching methods:	Traditional lecture; <i>cooperative learning; problem solving</i> . Seminars with teachers from other universities
Assessment methods	Oral, with preparatory written test
Evaluation criteria	<p>The study and knowledge of writing experiences of the Italian authors in their fundamental works solicit cues for interpretation between different methods and perspectives. Sociological, rhetorical and institutional data and historical and technical factors are from time to time reviewed; they aim to define the characters of the entire cultural system, in a wider anthropological horizon, to highlight the value of global knowledge that Italian literature has assumed over the centuries, between Dante and the twentieth century, up to constitute as identity code of the same nation, in connection with the Coeval European culture in Interdisciplinary perspective, linked to the arts. Evaluation criteria in four levels:</p> <p>-1) the student demonstrates knowledge and ability to understand in a postsecondary study field at essential and minimum levels; -2) the student demonstrates knowledge and ability to understand, with the use of textbooks in their correlation and in the linear comparison of the sources, in</p>

	<p>simple communicative skills; - 3) the student demonstrates articulated knowledge and ability to understand, also specific topics, in an appropriate language and he/she knows how to apply his/her knowledge/skills to devise and support arguments and to interpret the useful data to determine autonomous reviews; - 4) the student demonstrates well-articulated knowledge and understanding, also on specific topics, with appropriate language, to devise and support arguments, and he/she knows how to communicate and interpret information, ideas, problems and solutions with specialist interlocutors and not, with personal style in a high degree of autonomy.</p>
