The graduation goal is defined as the minimum level a student is expected to reach before graduation. Students must demonstrate good appreciation of the subject matter including, where appropriate, methodological and technical skills.</p> <p>Students that do not pass their final exam can re-take it according to schedules set by the University.</p> <p>Oral exams take place during regular exam sessions and are published on the academic calendar. At the end of the oral exam, students will receive a grade, expressed in thirtieths, as well as credits and a certification of their level.</p>
