Learning Objectives	<i>The course aims to provide students with knowledge of digitalization processes and the necessary professional skills to face the challenges of digitizing DEA assets. The course will consist of a module in which, through classroom activities, seminars, and laboratory insights, students will deepen their knowledge of heritage, which is still unknown to most people, and digital methodologies.</i>

Syllabus	<p><i>The course will delve into methods and techniques for digitizing DEA assets. The introduction will provide a general overview of the types of goods that fall within the DEA domain. Given the diversity and complexity of the assets, the description standards used in their cataloging will be taken into consideration, with reference to the rules defined by the Central Institute for Cataloging and Documentation (ICCD) and in the National Digitization Plan. Subsequently, the topic of digitization applied to the different DEA typologies and the management of digital collections will be explored in depth through in-depth analysis of national and European regulations and programming. At the end of the course, by frontal training integrated with laboratory exercises, students will have acquired the skills necessary to digitize the different types of demo-ethno-anthropological heritage.</i></p>
