Content knowledge	The course is focused on a range of key-words of the sociology of intercultural processes, by starting from the main theories and empirical research and with a specific attention to the interdisciplinary approach and the overcoming of the classical dichotomy macro-micro. The second part of the course will be dedicated to the analysis of the main themes and areas of practice of the sociology of intercultural processes, by exploring its main issues and concepts by using the specific sociological glossary. The last part will focus on practices of recognition of the cultural capital in the light of the most recent cultural and educational issues. A particular attention will be accorded to the work with refugees' people, by looking more in depth to the different professional application of the knowledge offered by the course
