Syllabus	
<b>Learning Objectives</b>	This course aims at offering guidance for theory and technique in community social psychology, in order to understand the effects of the interaction between individual and environment on person, group and community. Through theoretical models and methodological tools, this course promotes the understanding of communities' psychosocial processes and the elaboration of multilevel social interventions. By deepening the community work in different fields, the trainee will be able to connect constructs and tools to real application contexts in order to design community interventions.
<b>Course prerequisites</b>	Basic contents of Social Psychology of Groups
<b>Contents</b>	This course will describe the interaction between individual and environment by specific knowledges of community social psychology: theoretical models for the analysis of community contexts and methodological tools for social intervention. So it will focus on the ecological approach to community psychology, individual and collective empowerment, sense of community, prevention and promotion of well-being, group as intervention tool, focus groups, action-research and participation, application fields of community psychology.
