Learning Objectives	The course aims to provide and implement technical and methodological knowledge and skills in order to perform the psychodiagnostic interventions in clinical and therapeutic settings. The specific course's objects are the following: a) to understand the state of normal and/or psychopathologic individuals' development; b) to identify and manage peculiar psychodiagnostic tools for clinical assessment; c) to manage clinical case analysis and evaluation of personality psychopathology; d) to acquire a methodological competence for clinical interventions and treatments e) to acquire specific competences in the diagnosis of trauma and dissociative disorders.

ASSESSMENT AND FEEDBACK			
Methods of assessment	The final exam consists in a written test (clinical case analysis and discussion) and in an oral test about all subject's contents. The oral test is only allowed if written test is passed.		
Evaluation criteria	The final exam will aim to verify the level of the student's mastery with respect to the contents proposed during the course with a specific consideration for: — references to theory and discipline's epistemological and methodologic foundations (knowledge and understanding); — references to methods and procedures of psychodiagnostic assessment — ability to make conceptual inferences about psychodiagnostic assessment (making informed judgments and choices); — lexical appropriateness related to the specific subject's language; (communicating knowledge and understanding) — ability to elaborate contents in psychodiagnostic process (capacities to continue learning).		
Criteria for assessment and attribution of the final mark	Based on the evaluation criteria described above, a score on a 30-point scale will be given. The exam is passed only when the grade is greater than or equal to 18/30 in both (written and oral) tests with an attribution of the final mark maximum of 30/30 cun laude.
