Assessment criteria	<p>Knowledge and understanding: Acquisition of the theoretical basis of the discipline and interactions with other disciplines acquired in the course of studies.</p> <p>Knowledge and understanding applied: Assessment of the applicability of the notions learned in practice and in relation to concrete cases.</p> <p>Judgment autonomy: To stimulate self-verification of knowledge.</p> <p>Communication skills: Assessment of exposure quality, synthesis skills and depth of conceptualization.</p> <p>Ability to learn: Assessment of learning ability by speculative reasoning.</p>
