Contents	The first part of the course is intended to provide a basic preparation
	about the history of Italian art from the 9th to the 14th century.
	The lessons will focus in particular on the following topics:
	Carolingian and Ottonian art, Romanesque in Europe and Italy, Gothic in
	Europe and Italy, artistic production and the Frederician court, painting
	between XIII and XIV century in Italy.
	The second part aims to examine the allegories of the months in the
	Middle Ages, in particular the calendars carved in stone, capturing the

	representation of man, nature and work tools.
