Syllabus	
Learning Objectives	The aim of the course is to introduce the modern theory of cataloguing and to analyse, also in their practical application, the new Italian cataloguing rules (REICAT) and their information output in online catalogues. The last lessons are devoted to the theory of indexing and the most widely used systems of subject cataloguing as well as classification.
Course prerequisites	The student must have acquired the cultural and disciplinary knowledge provided by high school curricula and the first year of the bachelor's degree program.
Contents	Theories, principles, and techniques of nominal and descriptive cataloging: history, objectives, functions, and structure of the author and title cataloguing. History, objectives, functions and structure of the catalogue. The Italian cataloging rules (REICAT). The bibliographical description. The authority control. The information technology applications, cooperation and library networks. Subject indexing. Subject headings (with the Nuovo Soggettario) and Dewey Decimal Classification. Current trends in cataloguing.

Methods of assessment	Oral examination with practical test
Evaluation criteria	The examination includes a practical cataloguing test and discussion of the case dealt with, with references to the principles and criteria to be used and the regulations adopted. Questions are also asked about cataloguing and indexing systems and the principles and criteria used in the Cataloguing Rules. In particular, the ability to correctly describe and catalogue a current publication, the ability to justify one's choices in relation to the standards and principles, as well as knowledge of the main problems of the subject are taken into account for the assessment.
Criteria for assessment and attribution of the final mark	The assessment criteria for each of the learning outcomes as listed above will take into account the level of maturity of the skills the candidate will be able to acquire from both classroom learning and self-study, and his or her ability to express them during attendance and at the time of the examination.
