Syllabus	
Prerequisites/requirements	Knowledge of general and historical geographic elements of the Mediterranean and European area; basic knowledge of Greek ancient history; tools to integrate any gaps. It is also required skill in understanding and re-elaborating specific content in Italian language and in learning and applying terms and expressions borrowed from ancient languages and other modern languages.
Expected learning outcomes	Acquisition of the basic methodological tools for a proper approach to the subject. Knowledge of the historical dynamics and cultural interrelations that characterize the Greek colonization in southern Italy. Ability to apply the knowledge acquired to the interpretation of Greek sites and material productions in the West between the ninth century BC. and the Hellenistic age. Acquisition of an independent critical approach to archaeological disciplines and to the evaluation of the real and virtual usability of specific course contents. Acquisition of the archaeological lexicon to communicate the specific contents of the academic subject.

Teaching methods	The lectures will be accompanied by multimedia presentations of specific contents of the discipline and by collective exercises of research, use and critical evaluation of the tools for further study. Visits to some sites and museums in Puglia are planned, if possible.
Assessment methods	Final oral exam on all topics developed during the course. Attending students will be given the possibility of on-the-spot prevailing during classroom exercises.
Evaluation criteria	Students must demonstrate that they have acquired at least sufficiently the basic methodological tools for an appropriate approach to the discipline. They must also demonstrate adequate knowledge of the contents and ability to interpret them, rework them independently and present them through appropriate language.
