Teaching Methods	<ul> <li>The course is based on an interdisciplinary didactic method, through face to face lectures that are integrated with slides and deepened by workshops.</li> <li>The course also offers some lectures given by experts from different Italian and foreign Universities.</li> </ul>	
Evaluation Methods	At the end of the course, every student has to take an oral exam, that concerns the topics included in the bibliography and the analyzed primary sources. The <b>scheduled calendar</b> is available on the website of the Degree course. The students must use the <b>online system (Esse3)</b> in order to enroll to the list of candidates for the final exam.	
Evaluation criteria	<ul> <li>The student must be able to:</li> <li>trace the evolution of Christianity from the origins to the time of Theodosius I;</li> <li>show that he is aware of the main questions relating to the relationship between Christianity and paganism, as well as to the times and methods of spreading Christianity in the Roman Empire;</li> <li>treat and expose, with logical coherence and mastery of language, themes such as: <ul> <li>the construction of Christian identity;</li> <li>the establishment of the first ecclesial communities;</li> <li>persecutions;</li> <li>apologetics;</li> <li>the anti-Jewish controversy;</li> <li>the forms of sacralization of spaces and places of worship.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
Thesis Requirements and/or assignment methods	In order to discuss the final thesis in the discipline it is necessary to have attended the lessons given during the course. The topic of the thesis will be agreed with the student following an interview with the Professor, during which the student will be able to illustrate his/her course of study, his/her interests and his/her skills.
