The student, after gaining the basic skills in the historicalhagiographical research, will apply this research methodology, in order to critically read and interpret sources that are different to the ones analysed during the course, that are related to different historical, geographical, cultural and religious contexts.

At the end of the course, the student will gain critical and autonomous skills in the interpretation, of themes and problems relating hagiography, even from to interdisciplinary perspective. .

At the end of the course, the student will acquire a terminoogy which will make him able to express the very specific contents of this subject matter in a proper and rigorous way

## Ability to learn

At the end of the course, the student will prove his comprehension of specific and still transversal competences, in order to understand deeply the birth and the evolution of cultic phenomena through precise historical contexts

## Contents of teaching

After outlining the foundations of the subject matter, the main issues about the main aspects of the cultic phenomenon will be object of this course: the birth and development of the worship of the saints and the martyrs until the Middle Ages (with a specific analysis of the hagiographical source production); identification of the contexts, the patronages and the public in the production of hagiographical texts: the martvrological production (from the Martvrologium Hieronymianum to the historical martyrologia); the christian pilgrimage; the dynamics in the sacralization of space and the christian sanctuarial phenomenon.

Didactic methods	An important part of the course is the active and critical participation of the students (comment to the source dossier, oral presentation of matters that are interesting for the students), as well as the front lessons. Lessons are supported by projections of powerpoint presentations to stimulate the involvement of the students.
Evaluation methods	The final exam will be an oral exam about the subjects of the course.  It is possible, via agreement with the professor, to replace, or integrate parts of the syllabus with specific aspects of the hagiography, also in the form of a midterm exam.  The exam calendar is published on the degree course website and on Esse3  To register for the exam, it is mandatory to use the Esse3 system.
Evaluation criteria	The purpose of the course is the acquisition of a historical-critical methodology in the hagiocaphical area, with particular reference to the birth and development of the cult of the saints and the martyrs; to the rooting of cults in precise historical and geographical contexts; to the identification of contexts, patronages and public in the production of hagiographical texts. The student must also prove the acquirement of the terminology and the critical capacity which are specific to the subject matter.
