Learning Objectives	Knowledge of the complex dynamics of the Christianization of society, with particular attention to issues relating to the impact with paganism and the birth of the Church
Course prerequisites	Basic knowledge of History; comprehension and written text interpretations skills.

on:	Knowledge of the main aspects of the history of the church, with particular reference to the impact with the pagan society and the other religious systems (persecutory phenomenon) and to the creation of specific Christian identity criteria: (liturgy, places of worship, Canon, relationship between heresy and orthodoxy, ecclesiastical hierarchy). At the end of the classes, the student, after acquiring the basic tools of the historical-christianist research, will be able to analyse and interpret the multitude of sources (literary, documentary, iconographical, archaeological, monumental sources), related to the birth of the Church as an Institution.
Applying knowledge and understanding on:	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• <i>Knowledge and understanding applied skills</i> The student, after gaining the basic skills in the historical- christianist research, will apply this research methodology, in order to read and interpret sources that are different to the ones analysed during the course, that are related to different historical, geographical, cultural and religious contexts.
Soft skills	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• <i>Making informed judgments and choices</i> At the end of the course, the student will gain critical and autonomous skills in the interpretation, of themes and problems relating to the history of the Church, even from an interdisciplinary perspective.• <i>Communicating knowledge and understanding</i> At the end of the course, the student will acquire a terminology which will make him able to express the very specific contents of this subject matter in a proper and rigorous way.• <i>Capacities to continue learning</i> At the end of the course, the student will prove his comprehension of specific and still transversal competences, in order to understand deeply the birth and the evolution of religious phenomena through precise historical contexts.
Syllabus	
Content knowledge	The course purpose is to investigate the modalities and the forms of the spreading and the development of Christendom, from the beginning to the Late-Antique, relating to the birth of the Church as an Institution, and with particular attention to the transition from heresy to orthodoxy, from “the churches” to “the Church”. Issues related to the impact of Christianity with paganism will be object of this course, with particular reference to the persecutions; the organization of the first communities; to the role that women played; to the creation of the ecclesiastical hierarchy; to how the concept of ‘primacy of the Church’ was created; to the birth of martyr and saint worship; to the related development of pilgrimage and the sanctuarial phenomenon

Assessment	
Assessment methods	<p>The final exam will be an oral exam about the subjects of the course. It is possible, via agreement with the professor, to replace, or integrate parts of the syllabus with specific aspects of the history of the ancient Church, also in the form of a midterm exam.</p>
Assessment criteria	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Knowledge and understanding: Subject of the evaluation will be the ability to understand the issues related to the birth of the institution of the church, also in relation to the impact with paganism and other religious systems, treating consistently the lines of development until the end of the fourth century. • Applying knowledge and understanding: Subject of the evaluation will be the ability to apply the understanding of historical-religious phenomena of the past and the analysis of different sources that can be linked to them to present-day society. • Autonomy of judgment: Subject of evaluation will be the ability to critically evaluate the



	<p>formation of a historical-religious tradition in relation to precise historical and geographical contexts with autonomy of judgment</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• <i>Communicating knowledge and understanding:</i> Subject of the evaluation will be the ability to demonstrate the acquisition of research methodology specific to the discipline.• <i>Communication skills</i> Subject of the evaluation will be the ability to demonstrate the acquisition of lexical mastery specific to the discipline.• <i>Capacities to continue learning</i> The object of evaluation will be the ability to learn new research perspectives for understanding Christianity in relation to the birth of the church, deconstructing outdated acquisitions.
Final exam and grading criteria	<p>The student must prove the comprehension and the knowledge of the issues about the birth of the Church as an Institution, also relating to the impact with paganism and other religious systems, building its overall picture until the end of the fourth century.</p> <p>Moreover, the student will be evaluated on the acquisition of specific skills for the discipline, both at the level of language mastery and at the level of critical capacity and autonomy of judgment, and on his ability to apply these skills to different contexts than those examined in class.</p> <p>The final grade is awarded in thirtieths. The examination is considered passed with a minimum grade of 18, according to the following scheme that takes the quality of the exam into account:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- 18-21: sufficient- 22-24: satisfactory- 25-27: good- 28-30 (with possible award of honours): very good or excellent.
