Knowledge and understanding on:	In the course of exam preparation, students must develop a proper disposition to understand the underlying reasons, referring to problematic passages, those considered crucial.
Applying knowledge and understanding on:	When reasoning in terms of 'applied knowledge' in a field such as philosophy of language, one cannot ask anything of a student other than a disposition to a philosophical analysis of a case study established during the examination.
Soft skills	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Making informed judgments and choices</i> At the end of the course the student have to able to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Identify a problem. - Collect data and information. - Brainstorm all possible alternatives. - Weigh the alternatives. - Take his/her pick. - Enact a plan. - Review the decision.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Communicating knowledge and understanding</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The disposition to organize a comprehensive report on a topic that is a problematic junction in a concise but clear manner in every respect is what is required in the examination. • <i>Capacities to continue learning</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ By the beginning of a second year, a student is expected to have developed a disposition to understand what is the most effective way to continue an independent study in the light of the information gathered.

Methods of assessment	The exam that concludes the course takes place in oral form and is characterized by a free opening statement followed, however and briefly, by a series of questions on the entire programme.

Criteria for assessment and attribution of the final mark	The criteria are the well-established ones, i.e. capacity for synthesis when representing a problem together with an analytical capacity for reasoning.
