Learning Objectives	Historical research and historiography have for some decades been		
	confronted with the "cultural turning point", with an approach that has		
	crossed all the humanities and social sciences, with new problems, a new		
	dialogue with sources, new perspectives. Important transformations in the		
	method, in the themes and in the sources have opened profitable research		
	paths, always open to the comparison with other disciplines and always		
	characterized by a deep attention to the work itself of the historian, to its		
	theoretical foundations, to the historical culture of the time in which he		
	lives. The student will be able to explore this research area and to concretely		
	test its tools and perspectives, in particular and specific research activities		
	agreed with the teacher.		
Course prerequisites	Ability to orient oneself with respect to the main conceptual and		
	chronological scans of the contemporary age.		
Contents	What is cultural history? The course aims to provide students with the tools		
	to orient themselves with respect to the themes and methods of cultural		
	history. The first part of the course will be dedicated to an introduction to		
	international historiography and to research themes; with a specific in-depth		
	study dedicated to the relationship between history and memory, between		
	history and media, between professional history and popular history in the		
	contemporary age. The second part of the course will be dedicated to		
	specific case studies, with individual and group exercises and workshops.		
	The aim of the second part of the course is to confront directly with the		
	problems of historical research on contested, divided and removed		
	memories.
