Acquired competences will be adequate to tackle the understanding of political and environmental problems, at both the global and local level, proposing ideas and argumentations able to respond to contemporary challenges.
Soft skills	 Making informed judgments and choices. Students will have the capacity of collecting and interpreting data (also outside of the legal field), when these are useful to determine autonomous judgments, including the reflection on social, scientific or ethical issues connected to those judgments. Communicating knowledge and understanding. Students will be able to reason on wide ranging political and environmental issues communicating information, ideas, problems and solutions to specialist and non-specialist interlocutors. Capacities to continue learning xxxxxxxxx. Students will develop those capacities of learning which are necessary to start autonomously further levels of study.
Syllabus	
Content knowledge	In the first place we shall be concerned with the general issue of justice through the three keys of understanding most discussed in contemporary ethics: utility, duty, virtue. In the second place, we shall look at the liberal debate on theories of justice, considering utilitarianism, Rawls's theory of justice, libertarianism, communitarianism and the Aristotelian theory of desert. In the third place, we shall tackle key concepts of environmental ethics such as species and biodiversity, environmental justice and global justice. Finally, we shall move the focus of our attention on the relationship between political theories and European Union, considering: first, the challenge of populism to liberal democracy; second, the question of national identity and immigration; third, the populist challenge and conservative theory.
