The spectacle of the Risorgimento.

Political celebrities and communication circuits in the long 19th century

According to the more recent international historiography, the origins of the mediatization of politics don't date back to the first half of the twentieth century, but it is possible indeed to reconstruct a less recent genealogy of celebrity politics and political spectacle that in Europe as well as in North and South America accompany and support from the end of the eighteenth century the exit from the political (and colonial) Old Regime. As a consequence, these two strictly related trends — celebrity politics and political spectacle — represent an authentic original character of the construction of contemporary political space.

The 19th century was marked by a shift from an «old regime» of the media to a new system of public communication across the whole continent. New instruments for the transmission of images played a key role, with the diffusion of illustrated books and especially illustrated periodicals and panorama, favouring an exasperated dramatization of the narratives and stimulating a growing attention towards the celebrated contemporaries. This last element, in particular, points to the precocious birth of a true star system unthinkable without the abundance of images and objets circulating widely and rapidly (chimney ornaments, caricatures and lito-photographic portraits, cartes de visite) as well as through languages of strong emotional impact, that represent the ancestors of today's politainment.

Because of its profile as an transnational political process with global audience, the Italian *Risorgimento* represents an extraordinary laboratory for the mediatization of the new politics. It constitutes an authentic workshop of celebrities, employing an uninterrupted series of events and actors-

The course will analyse the communication circuits that turned the *Risorgimento* into a real spectacle for the contemporary

	European audience. The analysis will be carried out through a comparative investigation that will focus on the images and narrations of the major revolutionary and counter revolutionary events and on the development of the icons that best represent them (not only Napoleone Bonaparte and Giuseppe Garibaldi, but also a lot of characters like, for example, lady Hamilton, Guglielmo Pepe, Giuseppe Montanelli, Daniele Manin, Marianna De Crescenzo la Sangiovannara, Maria Sofia di Borbone).
