Learning Objectives	<p><i>The course aims to ensure the student an adequate mastery of general scientific methods and contents, as well as the acquisition of specific professional knowledge in the field of maritime activities.</i></p> <p><i>In particular, the aim is to provide an organic and complete knowledge of the discipline of the Italian criminal process, not only from the exegetical point of view, but also in a critical and from the point of view of living law, taking into account the doctrinal and jurisprudential elaboration, focusing specifically on the activities of the judicial police that the attendants of the environmental module will be required to cover.</i></p>
